Bird highlights for April 2020:

- Hoopoe - one near Ponsongath for a few days from the 22nd
- Lesser Whitethroat - A few sightings, including one currently singing from a thicket near Trewillis
- Cuckoo - My first was on 21st April at Penhallick
- Dartford Warbler - A species that suffers in cold winters and I hadn't seen any in the area for a long time, but a male was singing between Trewillis and Black Head on the cliffs was good to see
- Grasshopper Warbler - I've had several around Penhallick including one doing its 'fishing-reel' song regularly from the Downs just before Pednavounder
- Whitethroat, Willow Warbler and Sedge Warbler have all returned in reasonable numbers
- Great Northern Diver - 3 were in the bay this week, including a fantastic summer plumage individual
- Red Kite - I saw one from my garden on the 10th, several other people have seen kites as well
- Sandwich Terns - passing through in good numbers throughout April
- Wheatear - still a few passing through
- Barn Owl - One heard screeching away from my garden a few weeks ago
- Sand Martin - 10th and 11th April from Trevothen
- House Martin - Only 2 so far for me personally, hopefully many more to come. First was on the 19th
- Reed Bunting - 2 seen during the month, one at Ponsongath and the first one I've seen from my garden
- Stock Dove - Another garden first for me, flying over Trevothen this week
- Peregrine - I've continued to see them from the cliffs
- And perhaps the best till last, swallows seem to have returned in reasonable numbers. My first was on 6th April

On top of that, I know others have seen Yellow Wagtail, Ring Ouzel, and Siskin. Other wildlife sightings include Basking Sharks and Minkie Whale.
